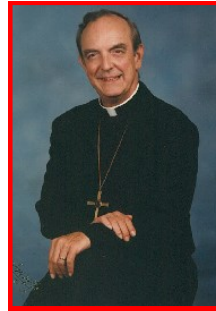


Our Speakers:

Carl Bratten has served the church as one of Lutheranism's leading theologians for the past 50 years. He has authored and edited numerous works, including *Principles of Lutheran Theology* (Fortress, 1983), *The Apostolic Imperative* (Augsburg, 1985), *In One Body Through the Cross: The Princeton Proposal for Christian Unity* (Eerdmans, 2003), and *Essential Lutheranism* (ALPB, 2012). Dr. Bratten is professor emeritus at the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago and co-founder with his life-long friend, Robert Jenson of blessed memory, of the Center for Catholic and Evangelical Theology and its journal, *Pro Ecclesia*.

Don Fairbairn is the Robert E. Cooley Professor of Early Christianity and Academic Dean of Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, Charlotte Campus. He holds an A.B. in English literature from Princeton University, an M.Div. from Denver Seminary, and a Ph.D. in patristics from the University of Cambridge. He has taught full-time at Donetsk Christian University (4 years), Erskine Theological Seminary (11 years), and Gordon-Conwell (7 years so far). He has also taught part-time at the Evangelical Theological Faculty in Leuven, Belgium (13 years so far) and has taught courses as an adjunct at many other institutions, including the Cambridge Summer School of Theology, Denver Seminary, Greek Bible College, Haddington House (Prince Edward Island), IFES Eurasia, North Caucasus Bible College (southern Russia), and the REALIS Institute (Kiev).

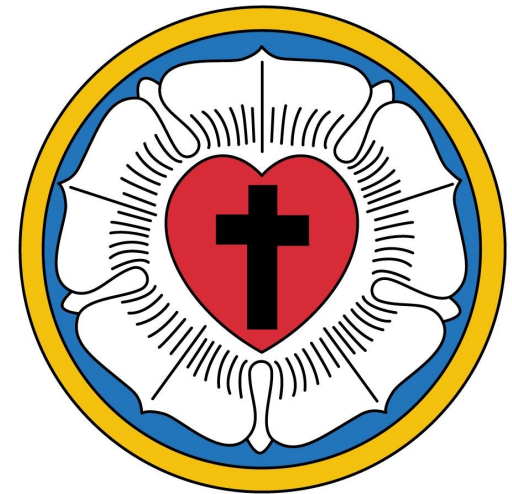


The Rev. Dr. Michael C.D. McDaniel (1929-2003) of blessed memory served as bishop of the North Carolina Synod of the former LCA from 1982 to 1987 and then of the ELCA from 1988 to 1991. Prior to his episcopal call, Bishop McDaniel served as a parish pastor and then from 1971 to 1982 as a professor of religion and philosophy at Lenoir-Rhyne College in Hickory, NC. 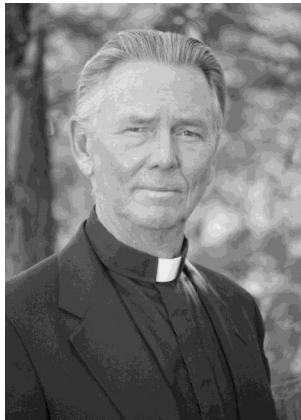
